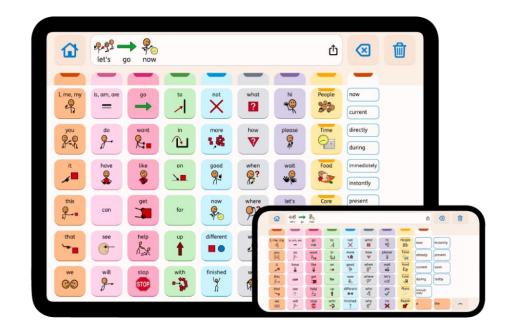

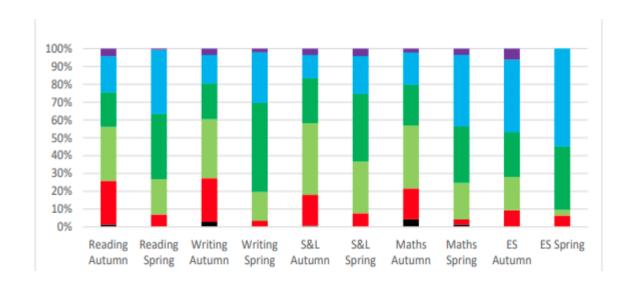

Progress Data Autumn 2024 – Spring 2025 (whole school)

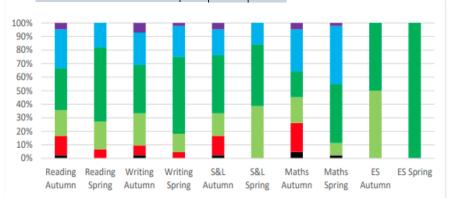


More students are now on track or exceeding expectations, while the number of students making no progress has significantly decreased.

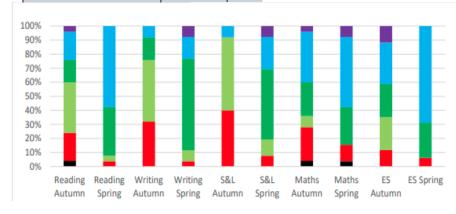

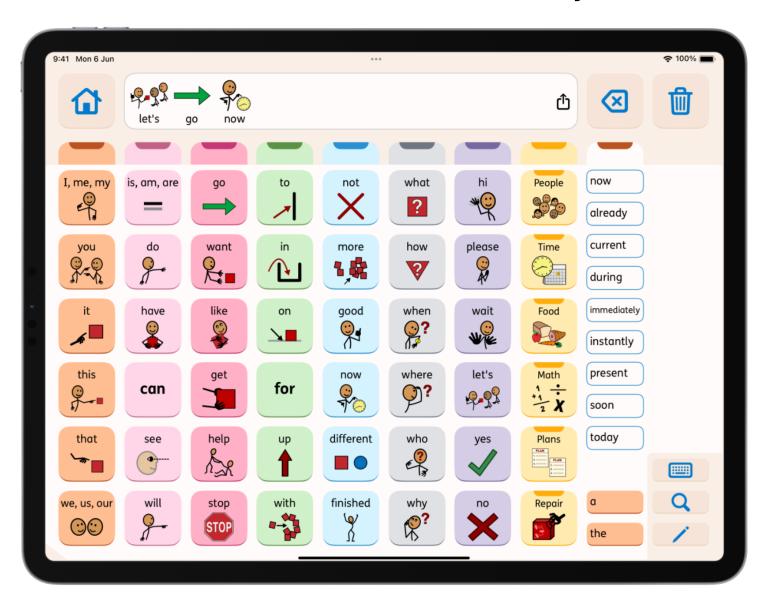
