

Appendix 2 - The SETT framework questions

The SETT Framework is a useful tool to help teachers to assess their pupils' needs and consider how assistive technology might help. It should help ensure that decisions about longer-term use of assistive technology products are personalised, practical, and purposeful, supporting inclusion and participation.

Here are example questions you might ask pupils in each of the SETT areas, adapted to be age-appropriate and accessible where possible:

What worked/didn't work for you?
